Patrick Allen, Rockwell Collins

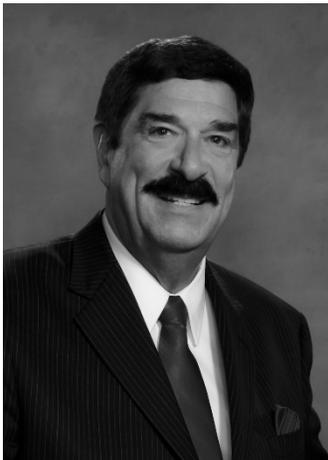

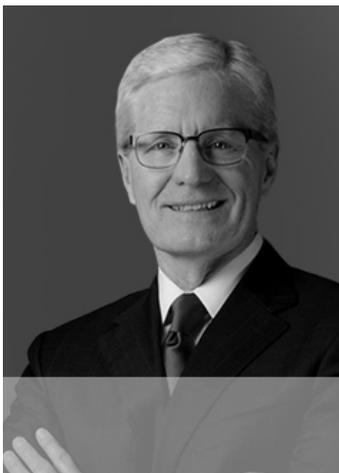
Jose Rodriguez, KPMG
